Centre for an inspection at 6.15pm and then on to the Armadale for a slightly later start than usual at 6.45pm.

Rob McKimm was the behind-the-badge member this week. Rob was:

- ❖ Born in Melbourne. Second of four children.
- ❖ Lived in Cheltenham from the age of 2. There were market gardens there in those days.
- ❖ Went to two State schools and then later to Haileybury College. Was a pioneer student at the new campus at Keysborough.
- ❖ Decided to take up medicine in the final year of school. Went to Monash for 6 years: 3 years at the Clayton campus, 3 years in various hospitals many of which have now closed.
- ❖ In his fifth year he went to Geelong hospital to do obstetrics and also because he wanted country experience.
- ❖ After graduation he went back to Geelong Hospital for three years and then practiced as a GP for a while.
- ❖ Then came a stint in the UK at Salisbury and Southampton. Couldn't stand another English winter so went to Waikato in NZ to a senior training job.
- ❖ Here he met his wife Kathy.
- ❖ Back to Melbourne and then on to Sale where he has been for 10 years. He described the ups and downs of being an Obstetrics practitioner in Sale.

Dr Ali Khan told us about the work of the Ramahyuck Centre. It is primarily a medical/welfare centre for indigenous people. It includes a farm at Longford on which grapes are grown. There is also a lawn-mowing service. It has a good reputation and carries out projects all over Victoria.

There are plans to open an evening clinic for the whole community which will bulk-bill.

One of the aims of the Centre is to make the Shire of Wellington the best place to live, work and visit.

Some more information about that Finland:  
*Finland has a highly industrialized, largely free-market economy, with per capita output roughly that of the UK, France, Germany, and Italy. Its key economic sector is manufacturing - principally the wood, metals, engineering, telecommunications, and electronics industries. Trade is important, with exports equaling almost one-third of GDP. Except for*

*timber and several minerals, Finland depends on imports of raw materials, energy, and some components for manufactured goods. Because of the climate, agricultural development is limited to maintaining self-sufficiency in basic products. Forestry, an important export earner, provides a secondary occupation for the rural population. Rapidly increasing integration with Western Europe - Finland was one of the 11 countries joining the European Economic and Monetary Union (EMU) on 1 January 1999 - will dominate the economic picture over the next several years. Growth in 2003 was held back by the global slowdown but will pick up in 2004 provided the world economy suffers no further blows.*
