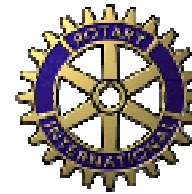

“THE AGONY AND THE ECSTASY”

Last week Rotarians and visitor were enthralled by Di Rowarth’s recollections of her South African adventure with Leo and Shirley Morrissy and Di’s daughter Jade. It was apparent that Di found aspects of her journey through part of the African Continent to be a very moving and emotional experience. Particularly distressing to Di was the very desperate circumstances in which too many black Africans find themselves. There is still obvious racial discrimination against black South Africans notwithstanding the dismantling of apartheid. Economic discrimination against black South Africans is rife and blatantly obvious.

By contrast was the happy and joyous occasion of Andrew Law’s marriage with his German fiancé, Silke, which, for Di, Jade, Leo and Shirley included a pre-Wedding week at the resort in Mozambique owned by Andrew’s father. For those newer members of the Club Andrew was a Rotary exchange student hosted by the Club in the early 1990’s.

No trip to the African Continent would be complete without a few days in one of the National Parks. Naturally, Di, Shirley, Leo and Jade managed to include several days in the Kruger National Park and make their acquaintance with the usual African wildlife.

Some interesting facts from Di’s presentation were as follows:-

1. Andrew is studying for a PhD in law in Munich;
2. Silke is a Paediatrician;
3. Mozambique had its first democratic elections in 1994;
4. Schools in Mozambique are extremely basic and have very few facilities;
5. Malaria is rife on the African Continent and many die from the disease;
6. Poverty is more apparent in the cities than rural areas;
7. Falling coconuts are a danger;
8. Part of the fence between Kruger National Park and Mozambique has been taken down to allow the animals to rehabilitate Mozambique. Apparently during the war years in Mozambique a large number of the native animals were killed and eaten

due to the desperate circumstances of the people.

9. Soweto is home to approximately 4.5 million people. They appear reasonably content as compared with the inhabitants of places such as Johannesburg.

10. South Africa (and Nelson Mandela) are thrilled about South Africa being host for the 2010 Soccer World Cup.

11. 1,500 people per day are infected with the HIV virus in South Africa.

Di’s enthralling presentation was followed by Leo retaining the interest of those in attendance by presenting on screen numerous photographs of the trip including the Resort in Mozambique, the Wedding, Kruger National Park and Johannesburg.
