Chairman Rob McKimm welcomed Rotarians and partners and wives and especially Governor Elect Ray Stewart and his wife Shelly.

Soon the microphone stopped working but was finally sorted out due to quick action from Eddie Graham and John Teychenne.

An “un- scheduled” event was held with the send off for Michael Rumpff and Brian Lay.

Charter member Harold helped send off Michael and Brian remarking that it was 27 years ago and two weeks ago, since the club was founded. Harold pointed out that Eddy Graham would have been a charter member but he was a **week late!**

Harold also pointed out that Michael was then on the road of prosperity as was the first Treasurer of the Club and has not looked back since. The club then first met in the Starlight room where we had very punctual meetings that started at 6:30 till 8:00 (but often finished much later, possibly due to extra fellowship?)

Harold mentioned how the club then supported the friendship house that is now gone. This house was intended for family of prisoners who could use the house whilst visiting prisoners at the Sale Gaol.

Whilst the house project was underway, many BBQs were held promoting the fellowship side of the new club. Treasurer Michael was full of ideas, and he suggested that the club could bottle surplus oil or gas and sell these to get funds for the club. Michael and Brian were active in Youth exchange with their own children. Michael was club President 1988. Brian Lay thanked the club and Pete Kluge for organising many working bees. Brian said that he will leave his “options” open and may return to the club again. He then donated \$500, to be used on Community projects in Sale.

During past President Les “uninstallation/farwell/retirement speech” he made mention of the support he had received from his wife, how that now he should be able to get this house under control now that John Mowat was taking over his role.

Les read out the highlights of the 2003-2004 annual report. He mentioned that he never had difficulty in seeking members to volunteer for the club whatever it was he was requesting. He felt that it is this feature that is the “GUTS” of the club that makes it so worthwhile. He outlined that the visiting speakers have been excellent and many thanks to Brendan. The good work of Shane was noted and that he now has to be replaced by 3 people because he did such a good job. Les pointed out that this year he wishes to disperse \$7000 to the following projects:

- The Vanuatu project \$2000
- Rotary Foundation \$500
- Centenary House \$500
- Nepal Orthopaedic hospital \$500 (the first Australian club to do so.)
- The Gudesh Foundation \$250 (This project organises plastic surgery and has most of its funding from Interplast)
- Sale Skatepark \$1000.
- Central Gippsland Health Service \$1000.
- \$500 to Sale Youth.

He reminded us of the following important points:

- Henna our International exchange student arrives on July 22nd.
- Membership of the club has gone down 3, and gained 3.
- The next District Conference is at Shepparton
- Les spoke of a rider in the Broome to Bairnsdale bike ride, who has artificial legs, will pass through Sale on October 31st.
- Les says that he now will “retire into oblivion”.

John Mowat was then “installed” as Sale Central Rotary President by District Governor Ian Stewart. Ian outlined to us the Rotary principles. He pointed out that John will be a **Centennial** president and he will be the 28th President of the Sale Central Rotary Club. John received the MOP (Manual of Procedure) on CD for his use. Ian then went on to say that he hoped to be available next year to install the next president “TBA”.
