Vanuatu Eye Care for 2004

The joint Rotary and Uniting Church Vanuatu eye care project will again leave for Vanuatu in September/October 2004. They will provide free eyetesting and testing for diabetes for remote population within Vanuatu.

Large number of secondhand spectacles have been tested and graded by team members and Rotarians prior to departure. These will be the main source of spectacles prescribed by optometrists and sold to villagers at a nominal price. Where it may be beyond the capacity of some villagers to pay, the glasses will be given free of charge.

Because of the travel logistics, the fourteen team members will be traveling in three groups and in the case of Dr Genevieve Napper and Dr Suit May Ho, will work independently. Genevieve and May are well known to Sale Central members, having been founding members of the eye care team. Richard Tatwin, the local co-coordinator is also well known to our club, and will be joining the team along with Tafea Provinces eye care workers. Teams will be mainly working in 5 groups, separating to service islands where travel allows.

The aims of 2004 are to:

Continue training local people and nurses who are placed in strategic areas throughout the country, creating a network of people with skills of basic diagnosis and refraction.

Provision of affordable professional services to remote areas that at present have no access to eye care and cannot be services locally.

Further establishment of the clinic and edging laboratory, with trained staff in Port Vila able to supply optical prescriptions at an affordable price

Team funding is a contribution from Sale Central Rotary Club, the Uniting Church, and team member contributions.
