Guest Speaker- Michael Young Gippsland Gallery

Michael last spoke at the club 10 years ago. He now wishes to bring members up to date with the Art Gallery.

Gippsland Art Gallery (I am giving it the acronym of GAG just for this report) is part of the art network of public galleries in NSW, Vic and other parts of Australia.

GAG is a not for profit organisation and hence requires donations and grants to keep going.

GAG has seen many changes starting from 1996 when the arts were formally introduced to country towns. Some potential asbestos problems in the old Gallery and the move to the old ESSO building and the battles with Jeff Kennett when he was minister for the arts.

Some gallery facts

- The Gallery occupies up 50% of Gippsland artists' work.
- It has have expanded into regional and national works.
- The Gallery has a Gippsland Schools program that has a membership of 38 schools, and have had 680 students visit.
- Friends of the Gallery have donated \$50k of National significance work to the Gallery.
- The Gallery have displayed works in Tasmanian wood and design crafts.
- The Sale Gallery has a value of approx \$700,000 as compared to galleries of similar size towns where value of \$10m is common place.
- The Gallery has storage problems, in that 40 % of their displays are held in storage.
- Due to a small number of staff they cannot expand.
