. LAST WEEK:

Last week we were visited by two representatives of the Centenary House project in Latrobe Valley. Rotarians, Margaret and Faye spoke to us on the project.

The Centenary House project started in November 2003. The project has a management team that meets every fortnight. The facility will be located in Central Gippsland to be available to all Gippslanders. Gippsland Rotary Centennial house will be a community owned and operated house supported by Gippsland Volunteers and the Latrobe Region hospital. Currently a site is being chosen near the Latrobe Hospital, however other sites are being considered. This is a huge project that is entirely supported by the community and business to raise up to \$2M.

A breakdown of the costs is: building costs \$1.2m, site, infrastructure, fencing, and landscaping \$500,000, furniture and fittings \$300,000.

Rotary Centennial house will be a single story building with an office and reception area. It will have 6 large motel style en-suite rooms. Residents will have access to a large kitchen, library, lounge, and living area.

A safe playground for children and Off-street parking will also be available to residents as close to the Latrobe Regional Hospital.

A group of people called themselves "Friends of Gippsland Centennial House" are supporting a range of fund raising activities.

The group intend to build a wall of approx 16m wide and 40 m long. The wall will feature towns that support the cause. Each group and person who supports the project will have a tile engraved with their details. The group will be also providing access to corporate sponsors who can have their business logo on display

The presentation made these interesting comments: one person in every 3 is touched by cancer. Look around the room and one third of us have a mother, father sister, brother, wife, husband, or friend who has this affliction.
