The Science Forum students gave presentations of the National Youth science forum 2005 held in Canberra. January 14-28 2005. The students at the University of Canberra Campus. The group learnt how to make science a career and how to achieve it. Learnt less about science and more about personal development, interview skills and communication techniques. The group had visits to the John Curtin Medical School, which opened doors for them and was not “nerdy”.
