National Youth Science Forum. Gippsland Grammar School and our 2 students from that school who attended the forum were all given certificates of recognition by Rotary

MUNA A model UN Assembly for youth to partake in will have 2 students from Sale College representing the 2 Rotary clubs from Sale. They will spend a weekend at Rawson and debate in a UN Assembly forum on topics such as Human Rights.

Jobs for Youth. A project originally set up in the Geelong area to find jobs for our youth in Regional Areas as distinct from Metropolitan areas. The aim is to try and alleviate the drain of our youth to the “Big Smoke”, with all the attendant future problems that will bring to the Regional Areas as a result of a lack of young people to keep these communities ticking over. Need to “spread the Gospel” to employers to employ youth and keep them “on the farm” so to speak. The enlistment of our local polities, Wellington Shire and Centrelink is in hand.

On the 17th March last a meeting was held with Don MacRaid to discuss this years program. Ideally 2 teams each with 2 optometrists, a doctor, a nurse or dietician and 2 admin doing the clerical and fitting of glasses.

The Lens Cutting Laboratory in Pt. Vila still not fully operational but ready to go with Richard Tatwin and an assistant to run it. Glasses cleaning and sizing will be done on a monthly basis. The first evening was at the Morrissy's last March
