International Service

John and Dr Andrew Ling are carrying on the work, promoting the 'Bowelscan' programme, begun by PDG Don Round. Don is in hospital battling leukaemia and John and Andrew don't all Don's hard work to disappear.

'**Bowelscan**' is a public awareness programme concerned with bowel cancer and its symptoms. May, each year, is 'Bowelscan' month.

Bowel cancer affects all people and 1 person in every 24 will be affected. More people die per year from bowel cancer than from road accidents. Early detection ensures total recovery. It is important to be tested each year.

Kits are available from John, but if you purchase one it should be used. All kits need to be returned by the end of May.
