Guest Speakers:

We had the pleasure of having Peter Gault (Mayor) and Lyndon Webb (CEO) from the Wellington Shire.

Peter spoke about the budget and problems facing the council with regards to this. The Shire now has a long term financial plan which has been required due increased charges and complications with regards to funding. The net deficit for forthcoming year is 1.79m but the debt level is down to 7.1m from over 13m 3-4 yrs ago Peter explained that the ratepayers expectation where for better service and the current reality is a decreasing and ageing population will lead to less funding and with current political situation not much chance of any major government investment in the near future. Lyndon explained how the funding was calculated. (Sounded like the old dart board method. Let's hope they don't miss the board). The shire is currently reviewing the rural zone, West Sale Industrial area, CBD zoning and the Port of Sale.

At this point Lyndon took the mike (the PA was working a treat) and spoke mainly about the planned development of the Port of Sale. The aim is to make it a major tourist destination and GO TO place rather than a GO THROUGH place. The plan incorporates new residential, retail, recreational, educational and tourism precincts. The development would involve private sector money and it envisaged that the next stage of the development could start late 2006 early 2007. By mid 2010 they hope to have planning controls and the development agreement in place. By 2015 they hope the development will be well underway including residential and TAFE.

Question time was a beauty especially when Hugo vented his frustrations over his recent subdivision with what he believed the lack of help he received from the Shire. Lyndon was very calm under fire.
