In Dallas Andrew's absence Les Jackson as chairman took it upon himself to give his BTB talk. We felt it was a way to have it done before Mary got wind of it!

Mary started life in Corryong, where she was born and raised. She attended both primary and secondary school there. After leaving school she was for a short time employed in Corryong before going off to Wangaratta to commence her Nursing Training.

It was at a dance that she met a Myrtleford footballer, who by his own description was somewhat "under the weather". We do suspect he did sober up as a long lasting relationship developed.

On Mary's graduation she went back to nurse at Corryong, and Les was a regular visitor. Les thought Corryong a "rough place" due to the influx of workers on the Snowy Mountain Scheme who frequented the town. It seems though that Mary's affection was worth that risk.

It is here that a rumour arose that Mary actually delivered our Viv Braham at the Corryong Hospital!! Mary applied and was accepted for Midwifery training at Box Hill for 1 year and then went to nurse in Wodonga.

By now Les' constant attention had paid off and he and Mary were engaged. Les, a carpenter at this stage had commenced building a home and Mary was busy in her nursing career, even being elevated to Deputy Matron! She was earning more than Les was!

Les decided on a change of career and took on teaching. So the "house that Les built" was sold and the happy couple plus one on the way moved to Melbourne in 1965 for Les to go to Teachers College.

Mary cared for their baby daughter and worked part-time, fortuitously as it turned out, for a Ms Hughes-Jones who gave an excellent reference when Mary left her service to come to Sale where Les was now to commence his teaching career in earnest.

Mary was told there were no vacancies for nursing jobs at the GBH, but with the glowing references she landed 3 jobs at the GBH.

Initially she did nights and weekends in midwifery but eventually did all hours of duties in the Obstetric ward, having only just slowed down to 2 days per week. A second baby son also arrived early in their stay in Sale. Now fully grown up and self sufficient he and his family live in Brisbane. Mary and Les are to visit them so that Mary "coo coo" over the grandchild while Les reconstructs the kitchen and landscapes the garden for his son.
