Guest Speaker

Jane Oakley bravely tackled the subject of "3G" or third generation mobile communications. Even with "Blackberry" and other second generation systems it is possible to synchronise data on a mobile phone with a computer network, enable rapid updating of calendars, diaries and job-list. Workers in the field can update tasks and log off when these are completed without the need to return to the base office. This has great potential to enhance efficiency in many areas such as building inspections.

A high speed mobile network has been tried in Gippsland recently, showing astonishing performance and potential. It will be possible to have videoconferencing over paired 3G phones. Many Rotarians at the meeting felt this may not be a good idea.

As 90% of Australian have a mobile phone there is great potential for new markets and applications, particularly among young users. With substantial investment in the GSM and CDMA networks Telstra will continue to be a major provider.
