**Guest speaker: Rick Watts talking on Business Management and I.T. in the 21<sup>st</sup> century**

Rick comes from Shepparton and has moved to Lakes Entrance. He manages the Business Management and IT team at East Gippsland TAFE. East Gippsland TAFE covers 14% of the state geographically with 17 campuses. The main ones are Bairnsdale and Sale; others are at Lakes Entrance and Fulham Prison. There are outreach campuses in Heyfield, Yarram, Orbost and Mallacoota. The purpose of Rick's talk was about how training is organised, particularly in the Sale area and for us to provide some ideas on how training might be improved. TAFE is basically funded by the Government, although about 40% of income is generated internally. Approx \$ 7-8 million dollars has to be generated annually to keep TAFEs afloat. New ways to generate income are required. For example courses for a local businesses can be arranged by putting a business through a training needs analysis to assess needs. In Sale the Flexible Learning Centre can handle smaller groups for training. TAFE needs to train to National endorsed standards and qualifications. Much of their training is designed by industry. Problems in the industry include needing skilled teachers and the availability of resources. The intake of traineeships has doubled in the last 18 months. Recognition of prior learning is provided. (Thankyou JT -Ed.)
