The Literary Dinner was an outstanding success. It was great that a good number of people, representing the whole community were able to come and hear Barry speak. It is impossible to report on what Barry said because so much fact was given with varying emotions. For many, the evening was very emotional. It was Barry’s first ‘public’ address and he wasn’t sure how it would go, but his presentation was first rate. He had spoken to RSL groups and fellow veterans, but not to a diverse group. Perhaps, if you would like to know Barry’s story, you might like to purchase his book which has been published with the emotion and language he insisted upon. He gave the publishers permission to correct the spelling and grammar, but to leave everything else as it was – if this wasn’t possible he wanted the manuscript returned.  
*A review comment:*  
“In and intensely personal account, Barry Heard draws on his own experiences as a young conscript, along with those of his comrades to look back at life before, during, and after the Vietnam War. The result is a sympathetic portrayal of a group of young men who were sent off to war completely unprepared for the emotional and psychological impact it would have on them. In particular, this is a vivid and searingly honest portrayal of the author’s post-war, slow-motion breakdown.”

**Volunteers load 2,000 ShelterBoxes bound for Indonesia.**

As soon as the first 45-foot wave of the 26 December 2004 tsunami hit their village of Lampuuk in Sumatra, Indonesia, two brothers, ages 11 and 14, started running toward a nearby mountain. By the time the third wave reached the shore, they had reached high ground. The pair spent the next two nights in a tree, scared and alone.

When the boys finally mustered the courage to climb down and go home, there was no home left to go to. Their parents and siblings had been swept away, along with about 6,500 others from their 7,000-person village.
