And now a reminder – Callerlab Subscriptions are due. So it is timely that we devote some space for Callerlab topics. Firstly I will reproduce some promotion material about what Callerlab has been doing for Square Dancing. Secondly I am reproducing the ideas submitted to the latest Triennial review which will be debated at the 2009 convention. All mainstream committee members would have already received them.

I must say I'm very shocked at some of the suggestions for deletion. Especially since I thought that the membership had already sent a very clear message about deleting moves such as "Spin Chain Thru" and "8 Chain". But it is obvious that there is part of the membership that doesn't agree. So I can't impress on you too much that if we want to take control of our programs we need to be involved. And involvement means that you need to be a member – not sit on the side and criticise the final decision if you didn't even try to be part of the process. I'm only talking about "involvement" here, not "commitment", but if you wish to go further you can also add "commitment".

If you are a member – please renew now. If you are not a member – please join up.

### **WHAT IS CALLERLAB DOING FOR SQUARE DANCING?**

**CALLERLAB, an international organization of nearly 2,000 square dance callers, held its first convention in 1974. However, the roots of CALLERLAB go back to the mid 1960's. CALLERLAB people have been working in many ways to help square dancing since then. To help everyone understand CALLERLAB and what it is doing, we offer this list of accomplishments:**

- **More than 25 years ago, CALLERLAB members developed dance programs that have been accepted world wide. These dance programs let you go anywhere in the world and call or dance.**
- **CALLERLAB members documented and negotiated international agreement on the definition of all the calls we use. For the first time ever, calls were taught the same way in California as they were in New England - or old England, Germany, and everywhere else.**
- **CALLERLAB has printed and published thousands of pages of publications to help callers and dancers. These publications are used by dancers and callers everywhere, including the members of other square dance organizations.**
- **CALLERLAB members are featured in nearly all of the calling slots at the National Square Dance Convention and conduct the caller training sessions at these same conventions.**
- **CALLERLAB has established a Caller-Coach program to improve caller skills and thereby better serve dancers. CALLERLAB also provides a broad range of caller training sessions at its annual convention.**
- **When BMI & ASCAP threatened clubs in the U.S. with license fees for every dance, CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB working together, negotiated a new form of licensing so that dance leaders could take over this obligation from the clubs.**

The following release from Callerlab will undoubtedly initiate a few discussions amongst callers and dancers alike. Please note that these are only first pass suggestions and have yet to be discussed. Ultimately a further list will come out of the Mainstream Committee at Callerlab soon. If you have any strong views then express them now to Mainstream Committee members – there are members in all states of Australia who will lobby on behalf of Australia if there is enough feedback supplied to them.

If you don't talk now – then don't be upset if a decision is counter to your (unstated) opinion.

A call on the Mainstream Program must receive a majority of those returning ballots to be added or dropped from the program.

### **DID YOU KNOW**

By Steve Turner Feb 2009

#### **This is a continuation from the July 2008 issue of Callerlink**

*After reading through the revised Callerlab Basic/Mainstream definitions, I found the following items that might be of interest to you.*

- It is now appropriate to call "4 Ladies chain across and chain them back for a DOPASO" rather than "Star back for a DOPASO".
- From a squared set, Circle Left, Ladies in Men Sashay, L.A., Touch ¼, DOPASO (partner left, corner right, partner left) would be a neat variation.
- On the call "RT & LT Thru & ¼ more", the courtesy turn will be a 270 degree turn, as a couple with the ending formation being a Right 2 faced line.
- The definition of Bend the Line allows bending lines containing 4, 6 & 8 dancers but discourages callers using Bend the Line of 2 dancers.

- The definition of "Walk Around The Corner" encourages callers to use the above and not "All Around The Left Hand Lady". That way, it will allow the ladies to look for their corners.
- SEE SAW is to be used only in circles. It has been dropped from SEE SAW to a Left hand wave.
- With DIVE THRU it is permissible for dancers making the arch to part hands momentarily if it is uncomfortable to reach over the diving couple.
- In a Wrong Way Promenade, a Wheel Around is still a Left Wheel action.
- At the completion of BOX THE GNAT, the hands should be in a handshake position.
- An Ocean Wave is a formation of three or more dancers holding adjacent hands & with each dancer facing in opposite direction to that of the adjoining dancer(s).
- The PASS THE OCEAN definition suggests that the right hand dancer walks forward to join left hands and turns a ¼ with each other as they are passing through.
- On the call EXTEND from a Left hand ¼ tag formation, the centers in the wave remain centers in the new wave. The ends of the wave remain ends in the new wave.
- If the ends were directed to CROSS RUN, they will end in the far center position of the formation & visa versa.
- The 1<sup>st</sup> couple Left/2<sup>nd</sup> couple Right command also allows us to use "Tag The Line & girls or boys go Left, Boys or girls go Right to a L.A. etc
- It is acceptable to call ZOOM while Single file promenading. For example "Boys are leads, Boys Zoom" or simply BOYS ZOOM.
- Callerlab is considering introducing the terms "Leaders & Trailers" to the Basic/Mainstream programs.
- It is improper to state that ALL 8 CIRCULATE always means that ends stay ends and center stay centers. This statement is true from lines and waves but not from Columns.
- The Ferris Wheel definition allow the following arrangement to be proper, HEADS LEAD LEFT,R&L THRU,VEER LEFT, HDS ONLY BEND the LINE, ALL FERRIS WHEEL, you're home.
- Turn Thru is always a 180 degree turn. From an ALAMO STYLE RING, if the desired action is to get everyone to their corners, arm turns should be used and not a TURN THRU.
- From a standard box formation, have the outside couple ½ sashay then call 8 Chain 3. This formation arrangement fits the definition, as the courtesy turn is standard Boy/Girl courtesy turn.
- PASS TO THE CENTRE can be called from parallel ocean waves.
- SPIN THE TOP can be called from a wave consisting of 3 dancers but the caller must specify who starts. Eg, RIGHT SPIN THE TOP.
- From a Left hand ocean wave, the phrase "Left Spin The Top" is acceptable as the "Left" is a helping word for dancers.
- The ocean wave rule applies to using SLIDE THRU from a wave.
- When working with Dolls/checkers, a short cut for Spin Chain Thru is ends Circulate and all trade with adjacent dancer.
- The only "Couples" movements used in Basic/Mainstream are "Couples Trade, Couples Hinge & Couples Circulate"

## WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN INVOLVEMENT AND COMMITMENT?

The difference between “involvement” and “commitment” is best expressed by a favourite Australian breakfast of “bacon and eggs” – in which the chicken has an “involvement” and the pig is “commitment”.
