



Western Australia is well known for its diverse wildflowers and technicolour spring display however few know of the well kept secret hiding in the South West corner. From late September to early November, thousands of these unique plants show off their flowers.



Each season is dependent on rainfall and sunshine, however in the area near Pemberton, the display is fairly consistent due to the high rainfall. Pemberton Discovery Tours offers visitors to the area an up close and personal introduction to the garden displays on the Beach & Forest Offroad Adventure tour with knowledgeable guides armed with reference books (should they be required).

The tour takes you off the sealed road and into the heart of the old growth Karri Forest which is usually draped in native wisteria, coral vine and clematis through the dunes and through a coastal heath garden of Pimela, dryandra, hibbertia and many other native plants full of colour. Numerous orchids peak out from between unsuspecting plants. The tour also visits the Beach and you may be lucky enough to see coastal birds that nest on the beaches during this time.



75% of Western Australia's wildflower species grow in the South West corner, Pemberton is located in the Southern Forests, half way between Margaret River and the Tree Top Walk. Many of the species found are unique to this area. The best time to visit for Wildflowers is late September to early November. Tours leave daily at 9am or 2pm from Pemberton all year round and the vehicle is comfortable for all ages.
